### May 2nd

**Indiana** [SB0516](#) Established the Indiana hemp advisory committee (committee) to provide advice to the office of the state seed commissioner (commissioner) regarding Indiana's hemp laws. Sunsets the committee on July 1, 2021. Prohibits the commissioner from regulating a hemp product.

### May 3rd

**Montana** [SB176](#) Allows for establishment of certified hemp plan and program

### May 14th

**Connecticut** [SB00893](#) enabled the growth of the state's industrial hemp industry.

**May 23th** [HB2601](#) prohibiting marijuana smoking and vaping in public places; licensing requirements and restrictions for medical marijuana license holders and caregivers; banking and finance standards; business restrictions.

### May 29th

**Colorado** [HB1090](#) regarding business regulation of marijuana licenses, including repealing the provision that prohibits publicly traded corporations from holding a marijuana license, was signed into law.

**Colorado** [HB1230](#) If approval is received by both the state and local licensing authorities, the bill authorizes legal cannabis hospitality spaces in which legal cannabis may be consumed on site and retail cannabis hospitality and sales establishments in which retail marijuana, retail marijuana concentrate, and retail marijuana products may be sold and consumed on site in the establishment's hospitality space.

**Colorado** [HB1234](#) The bill creates marijuana delivery permits for licensed medical marijuana centers and transporters and licensed retail marijuana stores and transporters that allow the centers, stores, and transporters to deliver medical marijuana, medical marijuana-infused products, retail marijuana, and retail marijuana products to customers.

### **May 30th**

**Alabama** [SB225](#) was enacted relating to hemp to require the Department of Agriculture and Industries, in consultation with the Governor and Attorney General, to develop a plan for monitoring and regulating the production of hemp, and submit the plan to the federal Secretary of Agriculture; to exclude from Schedule I controlled substances classified as tetrahydrocannabinols (THCs) derived from hemp; and to revise definitions.

### **May 31st**

**Alabama** [SB236](#) was signed to create the CARE Act. This allows possession or use of marijuana by a resident diagnosed with a qualifying condition who has a valid medical cannabis card for the medical use of cannabis and establishes the Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission.
